following which they desired might be put upon  
Record in case this house thought not fitt to pass  
the Act for Servants Affairs.

The heads of reasons of the lower house of  
Assembly why the Act for Servants  
Affairs should pass.

To be the 12th of July, the Assembly having previously  
considered the small profit of the Servants place  
by reason of the little quantity of land that remained  
unpatented which they conceived was the cause of the  
last Assemblys passing that Act therefore doe  
think it very fitt that it be continued as it is  
because the respective Masters have not the said  
12th of July in England which was made before
