This house doe upon perusal of their own Journall do finde if this house did not refer it to the consideration of the Lower house what punishment Major Tammam deserved, But Ordered that a Messenger should be sent to the Lower house to desire them to draw up a Bill of Attainder against the said Tammam (which when the Lower house shall thinke fitt to draw up) this house (as in the last paper they promised) will proceed upon.

Read 3rd Act touching Coopers and 4th Page of Tobacco Act, and passed there.

Read 4th Act Relating to Servants and Slaves and passed this house.

The house is adjourned till 10 a clock on Monday Morning.

On Monday Morning June 7th 12th. The House Met.

This house hath Considered of the Message sent from the Lower house touching his Lopt^s assenting to 4th Lawes to be made this Assembly, and whether he will Consent to Lawes in Gen^l before we present him with the particular Lawes desired to be passed, (But if the Lawes be first presented to the Late houses to be Considered it will give his Lopt^s alsoe time to Consider them, either as they are temporall or intended to be perpetuall respectively and then if they are temporarie onely, (may perhaps induce his Lordship to pass them as probationers with life Consideration, But if they are designed to be perpetuall (must of necessity take up more time then his Lopt^s Departure out of this province will permitte duely to Consider them, it being indeed utterly unsafe for the people of this Province as well as for his Lopt^s, to pass any perpetuall Act till Councille Learned in the Law of England it have been duely Considered, as the Lower house in their petition sent to his Late Lopt^s well observed. Wherefore this house desire the Lower house to Communicate to us the Lawes if they have in Readiness if we may desire his Lopt^s to vndertake this Session.

Whereas Capt. John Allen hath represented to this house the great danger which the Inhabitants about Lewis Necke in Charles County are in by Reason of the Mischeife intended by Capt. John and other Indians to that and other parts of the province, Ordered here that a Message be sent to the Lower house to desire them to advise of some Encouraging pay for Capt. Allen and his Troope for yr.
