Then was Mr. Carville sent to the upper House with of bill not presented too for his L<sup>o</sup>s. Approbation, and to desire his L<sup>o</sup>s. to appoynt the place to be built upon, Also to present to his L<sup>o</sup>s. the names of Commissioners to be inserted into of bill for Carrying on the building afores<sup>d</sup>. for his Lordships Approbation of them.
