The House adjourned till 6 of ye Clock to Morrow Morning.

Friday July the 3<sup>rd</sup> 1690.

The House met - then reads over what was done yesterday.

Committee of Acc<sup>ts</sup> Sent out.

A Bill for the Service of Almighty God and the Establishment of the protestant Religion - read ye first time.

Moved by a Member that his Majesty be addressed by this House in Relation to our Navigation Bonds.

The House adjourned for two hours.

Post Merchants - House Mett. - Resolved the following Message be sent to his Majesty and ye Hon<sup>ble</sup> Council.

By the House of Burgesses July 3<sup>rd</sup> 1690.

In obedience to your Majesty's Propositions relating to the act for free Schools this House have read and considered the same as it now stands, and considering the coil penning and length thereof - and as not onely the promulgating the same through out this Province but the publication thereof in England as a spread from thence in print - do therefore hope that the Continuance of the said act as it now is will not be any whit prejudicial to what is hoped or wish for thereby. Wherefore we humbly desire ye Attention thereof, may be further Suspended untill greater Necessity.

Messrs. returne to ye House and reports they delivered their Message to his Majesty who informed them it would not pass unless attend according to the Propositions.

Mr. Bladen his petition reads, Ordered that what Deb<sup>ts</sup> is allowed him this year Levy be levied and paid him in Ann Arund County.

Committee of Accounts enter ye House and lay their Journall before the House which is approved of.

The House resolve themselves into a grande Committee to confer with his Majesty and his Majesty's Hon<sup>ble</sup> Council.

His Majesty with his Majesty's Hon<sup>ble</sup> Council Came down to ye House and upon Conference had, It was agreed the following Propositions should be made to the Emper<sup>or</sup> of Swed<sup>land</sup>; Thom<sup>as</sup> Calvert, King of Chiapeco; King Peter, the King of Mattawoman son and several of the great Men attending upon the House, who being called before the House, His Majesty with the advice of this House told them that he would have the Chiapecos, Pamunkies and Mattawomans, go and live with the Emper<sup>or</sup>.
