to his Ex^{ty}. And that if any such officers having disposed of half the
old powder on the like terms and conditions - And that in case the
said powder cannot be changed and made good as a^{fo}. - It be changed
and made good yearly at the County Charge to be assessed by the Com^{rs}.

His Ex^{ty} having proposed to this House that if the breeding up of
Indian Youths in schools and fitting them for the University in Virginia
will not be one good Means to effect the Conversion of the Indians.

This House doe say that it is a very good Means to effect the same,
if any persons will be so Charitable to Educate them.

A Bill ascertaining what shall be ye Sheriffs duty in and upon Returns
by them made for publick dues and officers fees, read the third time,
assented to by the house and sent to his Maty^{ty} hon^{ble} Councille.

Ordered that 50^l Sterl. in the publicke Treasures hands be applied to
pay M^{rs} Heiman what is due to her, when the new Court house is
finished - sent to the Councille.

His Ex^{ty} having Communicated to the house a certain Letter by him
lately received from the L^{ds} hon^{ble} the Lords of the Councille of Trade and
Fouaigne Plantations, wherein it is intimated that the Assistance
formerly ordered this Province to contribute to New Yorke is required to
be new within

The said Letter also Intimating that there were some Ministers expected
into this Province, who had not had his Maty^{ty} gracious allowance of
20^l a piece; but that his Ex^{ty} upon their Arrival is ordered to pay them the
same, and his Ex^{ty} deficiency the same may be payed by the County he
having noe Money of the Kings in his hands.

Resolved (Memine Contradicente) that in case his Ex^{ty} has no
Money of the Kings, and the said Ministers arrive and require the payment
that his Ex^{ty} draw so much out of the publicke Treasury of this Province
to be paid out of his Maty^{ty} Money the first that comes to hand, and his
said Ex^{ty} order shall be a discharge therefore to the said Treasurer.
