

2. And that it may be the better understood that Laws and acts are enforced in His Majesty's said Province of Maryland you are with the assistance of the Council there to take care that all Laws now in force be revised and considered and if there be any thing either in the matter of stile of them which maybe retrenched or altered you are to represent the same unto His Majesty with your Opinion touching the said Laws now in force whereof you are to send a complete Body unto His Majesty and to the Commissioners for Trade and Plantations with such alterations as you shall think requisite to the end His Majesty's approbation or disallowance maybe signified thereupon.

3. And you are to permit Liberty of Conscience to all persons so they be contented with a quiet enjoyment of it, not giving offence or scandal to the Government.

4. You shall not pass any act or Ordinance within His Majesty's said Province in any Case for Levying Money and Inflicting fines and Penalties whereby the same shall not be reserved to His Majesty for the publick Uses as by the said act or Ordinance shall be directed.

5. And His Majesty further will and pleases that you recommend unto the next Generall Assembly the raising of such other supplies from time to time as maybe sufficient for defraying the other Charges of the Government.

His Majesty's Express will and pleasure is that all Laws to force for the good Government and support of His said Province be Indefinite and without Limitation of time Except the same be for a Temporary End and which shall Respire and have its full effect within a certaine time and therefore you shall not enact any Law which shall have been enacted by you Except upon very urgent occasions but in no Case more than once without His Majesty's Express Consent.

6. And that God Almighty maybe more inclined to bestow His blessing upon His Majesty and you in the wellfare and improvement of that Province you shall take speciall care that he be devoutly and duly served within your Government. the Book of Common Prayer as it is now established read each Sunday and Holiday and the blessed Sacrament administered according to the Right of the Church of England.

You shall take care that the Churches already built there be orderly and well kept and more built as the Province shall be by Gods blessing be improved and that he sides a competent Maintenance to be assigned to the Minister of each Church, a convenient house to be build at the Common Charge for each Minister.

7. And whereas upon Complaints that have been made unto His Majesty of the Irregular proceeding of the Captains of some of His Majesties Shippes of warre in the impressing of Seamen in severall of His plantations His Majesty hath thought fit to order and hath given directions to the Commissioners of the admiralty accordingly that when any Captaine or Commander of any of the Shippes of warre in any of His said plantations shall have occasion for Seamen to serve on board
