The Humble petition of Joseph Lambert  
Humbly Sheweth —

That your petitioner being the only living Executor of  
the late deceased the Reverend Mr John Lillingston cannot in  
Conscience but represent to your Hon<sup>rs</sup> the Great Loss that the  
Orphans of the said Mr Lillingston sustains by being deny'd  
the forty sh<sup>ill</sup> poll for that year viz<sup>t</sup> 1709. In which it pleas'd  
Almighty God to call their father to his Everlasting rest  
It is well known that the deceased serv'd in the Parish of St  
Pauls many years before there was any Ministeriall main-  
-tenance establish'd in this Province, in which times he could scarce  
acquire the bare necessaries of Life for his painfull & faithfull  
labours, and since the Establishment of the forty sh<sup>ill</sup> poll where  
-with he had to exercise his Charity it has been very Extensive  
and Conspicuous even to the maintenance of some whole families  
and to other pious and charitable uses, the benefit of which  
although he now reaps in Heaven yet his poor Children  
want it here on Earth the only designe therefore of this is only  
to offer to your Hon<sup>rs</sup> whether or not a Legall induction gives  
a right to the forty sh<sup>ill</sup> poll of that year in which it is made and  
if soe then year<sup>ly</sup> and Every year during the life of the incum<sup>ber</sup>
