Wee herewith send you Col<sup>l</sup> Blackistons Letter to us of the second of Juny last and recomend to you the necessity of our having an Agent in Great Britain to answer the objections made against our Laws, that upon Every little dissatisfaction to any particular persons, they may not meet the like fate Severall of them lately had - and further we hope you will take it into your consideration and make allowance to Col<sup>l</sup> Blackiston of his Salary agreed with him for to the time you thought fitt to give his Attorney of your Resolution not longer to continue him your Agent (and not as yet allowed which is fifteen Months, there having been only three years Salary allow'd him, as may appear by the Journalls - and must add that we are very sensible Col<sup>l</sup> Blackiston is a Gent<sup>l</sup>. as willing and capable to serve this Province as any whatsoever signed off order W. Which being read in the House - Its Resolv'd that since the Journall of the Committee of Accounts is closed and Reported to by this House and the Council the consideration of the Message be refer'd till next Session

The petition of John Clements recomended from the Hon<sup>ble</sup> Council read and the Consideration thereof refer'd till next Session of Assembly

Col<sup>l</sup> Holland and Sam<sup>l</sup> Young Esq. enter the House and deliver Mr. Speaker, Bill for relieving some Aggrieveds indors'd

By the Council in Assembly November 3<sup>d</sup>. 1710.

Read in Council the first and second times and will pass here, tho' we can have no reasonable Expectation but that it will be dispass'd at home unless we had some fitting person to speak to it there - signed off order W. Bladen C. Council

Read again in the House and pass for ingrossing.

Bill ascertaining allowances to Jurors and Evidences refer'd from last Session - Read the first and second times and will pass

sent up to the Council by Mr. Hudson and Mr. Stowey.

They Returns and say they deliver'd the Bill.

Afterwards Col<sup>l</sup> Greenfield entered the House and deliver'd Mr. Speaker the same Bill with reference till next Session
