Mr Marriartes and Mr Crooms enter the House Order'd that the Reverend Mr Butler read Prayers as usual at the usual times. Rules of the House Read Agreed to and sett up.

Resolved the House meet every ^{Day} at Nine a Clock in the Morning and Continue sitting till four in the Afternoons.

Resolved twenty two Members and Mr Speaker make a House to proceed on business this Session.

The House adjourns till Nine a Clock to Morrow Morning Wednesday the 28th October 1753.

Appointed for Committee of Election and Priviledges Mr John MacCall Mr Jones Mr Enalls Mr Jowles and Mr Coad

Appointed for Committee Aggravances Mr Tyler Mr Marriartes Mr John Whittington and Mr Tripp.

Order'd Mr Evan Jones be Clerk Assistant to the Clerk of this House and that he be admitted into the House.

Petition of Benjamin Woodward and Mary his Wife read and at their Prayer further referred till next Session.

The Presidents Speech read and order'd the Committee of Laws prepare an Answer thereto and lay it before this House to Morrow Morning.

The Members for Chalcornors County appearing without Indentures Order'd they withdraw and that the following order be sent to the Sheriff of that County.
