Ordered the said Bill be indorsed By the House of Delegates 17th December 1700 Read and assented to by the House of Delegates Signed of Order

Ordered Mr Worthington and Mr ~~Worthington~~ Roberts carry the said Bill up to the Council for their Assent They return and say they delivered the same.

The Honble Philip Lynes Esq, enters the House and delivers Mr. Speaker the three following ingrossed Bills viz^t

Bill ascertaining Attorneys Fees &c Indorsed 16th December 1700 Then was this Bill read and assented to by her Majesty's Honble Council and Signed of Order

Bill directing the Manner of electing and summoning Delegates Indorsed as above. Bill reviving the Act for Limitation of Officers Fees Indorsed 17th December 1700 Then was this Bill read and assented to by her Majesty's Honble Council

Ordered Mr Bladen C. C. Signed of Order

The Honble Philip Lynes, Esq, enters the House and delivers Mr. Speaker, Ingrossed Bill reviving the Act for ordering and regulating the Militia, Indorsed as above and also the Bill for Payment and Appointment of the Publick Levy Indorsed Eodem Die, Read in Council the first and second Time by special Order and will pass with the words Officers Fees be inserted. Signed of Order Mr Bladen C. C. Which was agreed to by the House and ordered the Bill be ingrossed and delivered to the Committee of Laws for ingrossing. The House adjourned for an Hour Eodem Die. The House not according to Adjournment. Being called over were present as before.

Committee of Laws enters the House and delivers Mr. Speaker ingrossed Bill for Payment and Appointment of the Publick Levy. Ordered the said Bill be read, and being read, Ordered it be indorsed. By the House of Delegates 17th December 1700 Read & assented to by the House of Delegates Signed of Order

Ordered Job Nicholas Lows and Mr Robert Tyler carry the Bill up to the Honble Council for their Assent. They return and say they delivered the same.
