Capt. Richard Jones, Mr Daniel Marartee and Mr Richard Clogate ordered to attend the Honble President and Council and acquaint that Board the Members of this House are not according to her Majesty's writ of Prorogation and that they are desired to see Mr William Talbot and Mr Charles Hammond sworn.

They return and say they delivered their Message, and saw the two Gentlemen sworn. The Honble Charles Greenberry and Richard Tilghman Esquires from the Honble Council enter the House and inform the several Members that the Honble President and Council commands them to attend him in the Council Chamber - Accordingly the Members repair to the Council Chamber, and being there admitted the Honble President and Council commanded them to repair to their own House and choose their Speaker and come and present him to him.

The Members enter the House and there choose Mr Robert Unglo a Member returned for Talbot County for their Speaker and place him in the Chair, not permitting him to make any Excuse. The House adjourns to the Council Chamber and there present their Speaker to the Honble President and Council. And Mr Speaker reverently directing himself to the Honble President disabled himself praying to be excused and that his Honour would command the House to choose some other Person better qualified for that Trust. Which Excuse his Honour would not admit but commanded him in her Majesty's Name to take upon him the same.

Mr Speaker in the Name of the whole House desired the Honble President on her Majesty's Behalf to confirm all the ancient and accustomed Privileges belonging to the House which his Honour was pleased to grant and confirm. For which Mr Speaker returned the Thanks of the House - And The Honble President declared the Reason of calling them together as followeth vizt

Mr Speaker and you Gentlemen of the House of Delegates
It having been under my Consideration when to call an Assembly I have been advised by her Majesty's Honble Council to convene you at this Time, not doubting you will have it in your View to dispatch the necessary Business of this Session in as little Time as may be and that your Inclinations are to place as little Charge upon your Closets as possible for which Reason I hope you will expedite what may be recommended to your Consideration, and also take the speediest Methods to raise such necessary Supplies as may be needful to defray the public Charge of this present Year, which
