It may it please your Gracys
Weo ye Delegates of this Province now assembled begg leave to returne your Gracys our very signed thanks for your most favourable Speech
The valuable proposals therein made (being of such consequence to ye Province in general) cannot but make a deep & lasting impression upon all who value or regard ye welfare of it. — As an instance of our ready obedience — to her Gracys Commands and your Gracys request weo shall apply our selves with our utmost diligence in ye Examination of ye Laws of ye Province in order to the amendment of such as shall want it in ye most expeditious manner and with as little expense as possible
The encouragement of Schools for ye propagation of Learning the advancement of ye Tobacco trade and ye shortening ye bound of Land are things of such consequence to this Province and so earnestly recommended by your Gracys that weo think our selves under a double Obligation of proceeding to consider and deliberate them in the manner proposed by your Gracys. weo hope that in these and all other particular weo shall sincerely endeavour to performe our duty to God, and take to acquitt our selves as dutifull and loyal Subjects to our Sovereign, as gratefull people to your Gracys and faithfull servants to our Country — Signed order J.
