house returned to their own House and then Mr. Speaker resumed  
the Chair and reported to y<sup>e</sup> house that his Excy the Governour with  
the advise of the Right Honorable y<sup>e</sup> Lords Proprietors Council of State  
in this Province had prorogued this present General Assembly to  
the first day of October next, to which time that House accordingly  
prorogued itself.
