House where His Excellency was pleased to enact the several Engrossed  
Bills follo: into Laws (being severally read and assented to by the  
upper House) by sealing them with the R<sup>t</sup> Honble the Lords Prop<sup>r</sup>ys  
Greater Seale at arms of this Province and endorsing them severally  
in the manner following viz<sup>t</sup> — May the 10<sup>th</sup> 1718.

House.
