Thereupon Mr. Speaker with the whole House went to the Upper House to attend his Excellency where his Excellency was pleased to enact the severall Ingross bills following into Laws by sealing them with the R^t. Hon^{ble} the Lords Proprietarys Great Seal at Armes of this Province and Indorsing them severally in the Manner following, viz.

1. An Ingross bill for Supplying certain Defects in a Conveyance of Land from Henry Roberts to John Ford.
2. An Ingross bill for Vesting and Settling an Estate of Inheritance in Fee Simple of an in a certain parcel or Lot of ground in the City of Annapolis containing one hundred and twenty feet in length on Robert Johnson of Annapurcell County Ship Carpenter.
3. An Ingross bill to Confirm to Mr. Gray of Calvert County, a small parcel of Land lying in the said County, sold by Robert Brooke to the said Gray now in the possession of the said Gray.
4. An Ingross bill to Confirm a tract of Land therein mentioned to the Rector or Minister of St. John Parish in Baltimore County and his Successors forever.
5. An Ingross bill for the Encouragement of an Iron Manufacture within this Province.
6. An Ingross bill for the better supporting the Magistrates in the Administration of Justice within this Province.
7. An Ingross bill Resplaining and Declaring particularly what Laws were repealed by an act intituled an act Declaring all Laws heretofore made which have been enacted this Session of Assembly to be repealed and reviving the act for relief of Ann Arundell County.
8. An Ingross Supplementary bill to the act for appointment of Constables and what relates to their office & determining what persons are taxable.
