 Mather's Petition being willing to be under the like Rule on my
 Obedient side Humbly Concerned this method will save your
 Honours, much time and that it is agreeable to a Parliam
 entary Proceeding I am with the greatest Submission

May it please your Honours, your most humble (and) obed
 ient Servant, I begg Leave, to present the proceedings in par
 ticular, C. Pulany, between the Duke (and) the Dutches
 of Norfolk, as a precedent, in this case, 27th October 1720

By the Upper House of Assembly October 27. 1720, this
 Board is of Opinion that the within Motion is just and
 Reasonable, and desire the Lower House, would direct their

 Copy of all the Evidence of any kind that lies before their
 House (and) name the witnesses to examine such witnesses

When Mr Speaker, with the whole house got to the
 Council Chamber, where his Hon^r: the Governour was pleased
 to enact the severall Ingot Bills following into Law
 (they being assented to by the Upper House) by sealing them
 with the R^{oyal} Hon^{ble} the Lord Propriety Great Seal at Annapolis (and)
 Endorsing them thus
