The following Message, was sent to the Upper House, by Mr. Dulany, and Three more.

May it please your Honours,

By the Upper House of Assembly, August 7, 1732.

We have agreed to the Amendments proposed by your Honours, to the Bill for emitting Seventy Two Thousand Pounds in Bills of Credit, except what relates to the Nomination of the Commissioners or Trustees to put the Act in Execution, by the Governor or President; which we cannot agree to: Not from the least Disrespect to the Governor, for whom we have the most dutiful Regard, or Intention to slight Him; but merely because we are well assured of our own Right, and the Regularity of the Commissioners or Trustees being nominated by the Assembly, in a Money Bill like this, which the Country is obliged to support at all Events; and should this House give up a Right so well known, upon a single Instance, past sub silentio, (for ought appears,) we know not how far it may be drawn into Example to the Prejudice of the People we represent; which our Duty and Interest oblige us to guard against with the greatest Care: And therefore we hope and desire your Honours will pass the Bill as herein proposed, leaving the Nomination of the Commissioners or Trustees in the Assembly, and inserting their Names in the Bill.

Gentlemen,

By the Upper House of Assembly, 8 August, 1732.

We are very sorry to find by your last Message by Mr. Dulany and Three more, that our insisting upon such a Clause in the Bill, as may impower the Governor or the President of the Council, for the Time being, to nominate Commissioners for putting the Act in Execution, should prove the only Obstacle in your House to the Passing the Bill, for emitting Seventy Two Thousand Pounds in Bills of Credit; which is allowed by a Majority among your selves, to be of the greatest Consequence to the Common Weal of this Province, as well by increasing the Trade and Navigation thereof, as by taking great Numbers of People off from manufacturing Tobacco.
