Mary's and Baltimore Counties, received in that Year; but as the Clerks of both those Counties have neglected to return Lifts, as the Law directs, the particular Sums cannot appear. And we beg Leave to observe to your Excellency, that although the Law directs the Money to be paid in Yearly, by the Twentieth Day of October, not one of the Sheriffs (ex ept the Sheriffs of

Calvert and Charles County) has paid any Money for the prefent Year.

Our Duty therefore obliges us to defire your Excellency will have the Bonds of the faid Four Sheriffs, who did not pay in last Year's Receipts, put in Suit immediately; and if the Movies received this Year re not foon paid in, that the Bonds of such Sheriff, who shall delay to pay in, may also be put in Suit; and that you will take such Measures as shall be effectual for compelling the Clerks to a Discharge of their Duty. We are the more earnest in desiring a speedy Proceeding against the Sheriffs, as the Public has at Times suffered greatly by Loss of Money collected by those Officers.
