That out of the above balance of £.984 11 10 $\frac{1}{2}$, there still remains due to sundry claimants on the journal of accounts, passed at November session 1773, the sum of £.437 19 2 sterling.

That the said commissioners have paid away to sundry persons, out of the 133,333 $\frac{1}{2}$ dollars, the sum of 10,625 $\frac{1}{8}$ dollars for torn and defaced bills, which your committee have counted and burnt, and that there now remains in the office the sum of 122,707 $\frac{1}{8}$ dollars, for the purpose of changing defaced bills, consisting of 774 $\frac{5}{8}$ dollars signed by the commissioners, and the residue remain unsigned.

That it appears to your committee by the accounts of the said commissioners, there has become due for interest on the 235,333 $\frac{1}{2}$ dollars, the sum of £.4258 9 2 sterling, of which they have received the sum of £.4066 18 2 sterling, and that the same now remains in the office unappropriated, for the purpose of erecting a college or seminary of learning.

That in pursuance of an act of assembly, "for raising and applying money towards erecting and maintaining a light-house on Cape Henry," the said commissioners have received from the treasurers of the eastern and western shores the sum of £.2245 12 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ gold currency, including £.282 common money reduced into that species, rating the dollars at 6/0 each; and from the several naval officers the sum of £.1233 9 0 $\frac{1}{2}$ gold currency, for the duty of 4 d. per ton; in the whole amounting to £.3479 1 11 $\frac{1}{2}$ gold currency, out of which they have paid to the directors for building the light-house the sum of £.2738 16 gold; and that there now remains in the office the sum of £.740 5 11 $\frac{1}{2}$ consisting of 42 oz. 9 dwt. 19 gr. gold, and the residue in bills of credit.

That your committee, to give the honourable houses some general idea of the several emissions, and the funds for sinking them, take leave to subjoin the following sketch:
