William Hindman, Esq; from the senate, delivers to Mr. Speaker the list of county lieutenants, thus endorsed; "By the senate, June 29, 1777: Read and concurred with.

The report brought in by Mr. Brice on the seventeenth instant was read and concurred with.

George Plater and Matthew Tilghman, Esquires, from the senate, acquaint Mr. Speaker that the governor requires the attendance of the members of the house of delegates in the senate immediately. Mr. Speaker left the chair, and (with the members of this house) went to the senate, and there presented the following engrossed bills to the governor, who signed the same, and affixed the great seal thereto, in the presence of the members of both houses.

No. 1. An act to continue an act for suspending the power of the commissioners for building a court house and prison in Harford county.

No. 2. An act directing the justices of Frederick county to ascertain the number of taxables in Washington and Montgomery counties, and to enable the sheriffs of those counties to collect their proportion of the public levy, as settled by the justices of Frederick county.

No. 3. An act to enable the corporation of the city of Annapolis to sell or lease certain lands, and to enlarge and ascertain the jurisdiction of the mayor's court of the said city.

No. 4. An act to revive and aid the proceedings of Cæcil county court.

No. 5. An act for the recovery of fines on non-enrollers.
