T U E S D A Y, April 21, 1778.

THE house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

RESOLVED, That each member of the present and every future general assembly be allowed on the journal of accounts twenty shillings per day for itinerant charges.

The bill, entitled, An act to prevent excessive gaming, was sent to the senate by Mr. Crabb and Mr. Bayly.

Mr. Forbes appeared in the house.

RESOLVED, That the governor and the council be authorized and empowered to assist brigadier-general Pulaski in recruiting for his legion; and that all persons enlisting in the same (not being inhabitants of any other of the United States) for three years or during the war, shall be allowed the bounty given by act of assembly to soldiers enlisting for three years or during the war, and shall be credited to the proportion of the county where such recruits shall have last resided; and such recruits shall not be subject to be draughted under the late act for procuring troops for the American army. That the said recruits be passed by the lieutenant of the county wherein they shall be enlisted, who shall keep an account of all such recruits.
