The engrossed bill, No. 14, was read and assented to, and sent to the senate, with the paper bill thereof, by Mr. Schnebely and Mr. Shepherd.

On reading a resolution of congress of the 7th of March last, recommending to the United States of America to set apart Wednesday the 22d day of April then next, to be observed as a day of fasting, humiliation, and prayer, on motion, the question was put, That the house adjourn till to-morrow nine o'clock? Passed in the negative.
