T U E S D A Y, December 10, 1782.

THE house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The report on the petition of Alexander Symmer, of Prince George's county, was read the second time and concurred with.

A petition from William Worthington, of Baltimore county, was preferred and read; and Mr. Kent, Mr. Courts, Mr. Magruder, Mr. M'Mechen, Mr. Sherwood, Mr. Courfey, and Mr. Hindman, were appointed a committee by Mr. Speaker to consider and report thereon.

A representation from doctor Ephraim Howard, of Anne-Arundel county, was read, and thereupon ORDERED, That the petition of doctor Ephraim Howard and counter petitions, referred from the last to the present session, be taken into consideration on Saturday the 21st instant, and that summonses issue for any witnesses they may apply for.

Mr. Kent, from the committee, brings in and delivers to Mr. Speaker the following report:

THE committee to whom was referred the petition of Martin Harry, of Washington county, beg leave to report, That on the petition of said Martin Harry, preferred to the last session of assembly, an act did pass, to empower him to sell a certain house and lot in the town of Snip-ton, in the county aforesaid, late the property of a certain John Waley, of said county, deceased, and the money arising from such sale to be applied towards discharging the just debts of said Waley; that by virtue of said act, he did expose the same to sale, and colonel Moses Rawlings became purchaser, but after sale made as aforesaid, on examining the title papers, it was found that said lot had been divided into two lots, distinguished on the plat of said town by the numbers 2 and 3; that the petitioner now prays an act may pass, to confirm the sale and the title in colonel Moses Rawlings. That your committee are informed by colonel Rawlings, that he objects to granting the prayer of said petitioner. Your committee are therefore of opinion, that an act ought to pass to empower said Martin Harry to sell said two lots of ground, and apply the money arising from such sale as directed by the former act. All which is submitted to the consideration of the honourable house.
