Amendments proposed. Page 1, in the 5th line, after the word "property," insert, "except land, houses, and real property whatsoever." In the 3d line from the bottom, strike out "two" and insert "five." Page 2, in the 5th line from the bottom, strike out "ten" and insert "fifty." In the same line, after the word "cent." insert "per year." Page 4, in the 6th line from the bottom, after the word "two" strike out "and a half." In the 5th line from the bottom, strike out from the word "houses" to the word "or" inclusive. Page 5, in the 3d line, strike out "lands or." In the fourth line, after the word "property" insert "except as aforesaid." In the 10th line, strike out "four" and insert "three." In the 2d line from the bottom, strike out "three" and insert "one."

THE committee, to whom was referred the petition of George Fitzhugh, beg leave to report, that they have examined the allegations therein contained and find them true, and that by the act, entitled, An act for the emission of bills of credit not exceeding two hundred thousand pounds, passed May session seventeen hundred and eighty-one, the lands of Daniel Dulany of Walter were ordered to be sold for the redemption thereof, except 500 acres of land, or thereabouts, on which George Fitzhugh lived.
