RESOLVED, That the feveral officers may and they are hereby authorized and empowered to fend out their accounts of fees due them on all civil fuits and executions wherein the ftate is and hath been plaintiff, and which fees are payable by the feveral defendants, and that the fherrifs of the feveral counties are hereby authorized and directed to collect and receive the fame by execution or otherwife, and pay the fame to the feveral officers, or their order, after deducting their ufual commiffions.

RESOLVED, That in future all officers return their accounts of fees to the committee of claims for which they claim an allowance from the ftate, fairly ftated, and fully expreffive on what principle the ftate is chargeable therewith.

RESOLVED, That the attorney-general be directed to ftrike off no fuit at the inftance of the ftate, before the fees are paid or fecured to be paid, in all cafes where they are by law chargeable to faid defendants.
