On motion, ORDERED, That the house take up the same on Wednesday next.
The house adjourns till Monday morning 9 o'clock.

M O N D A Y, November 30, 1795.

THE house met. Present the same members as on Saturday, except Mr. Winchester, Mr. W. Bowie and Mr. Horrell. The proceedings of Saturday were read.

Mr. John Barnes, a delegate returned for Washington county, appeared, and after qualifying in the mode prescribed by the constitution and form of government, and taking the oath to support the constitution of the United States, took his seat in the house.

The report on the petition of Thomas Beall and James Lackland, and the counter petition of sundry inhabitants of Montgomery county, was read the second time, concurred with, and leave given to bring in a bill pursuant thereto. ORDERED, That Mr. Burgess, Mr. Oneale and Mr. Davis, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

A petition from Samuel Launch, of Kent county, praying to be released of a fine and fees incurred on a certain indictment, was preferred, read, and referred to the committee on the petitions of insolvent debtors.

A petition from James Woodland, of Kent county, stating that he purchased several lots of land of a certain John Woodward, deceased, and praying the widow of the said deceased may be empowered to make him an effectual deed, in fee-simple, of the said lots, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. Pinkney, Mr. Barroll and Mr. Lloyd, to consider and report thereon.

Mr. Roberts, from the committee, brings in and delivers to Mr. Speaker a bill, entitled, An act to alter the public road leading from Miles river ferry through the land of Jacob Loockerman, of Talbot county; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

A petition from Solomon Oldson, of Queen-Anne's county, stating, that he overpaid into the treasury the sum of one hundred and fifty-seven pounds fifteen shillings and seven-pence, for certain confiscated property, and praying the treasurer may be authorized to return him the said sum of money, with interest for the same, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. C. Frazier, Mr. O'Bryon and Mr. Brown, to consider and report thereon.

A memorial from sundry inhabitants of Frederick-town and county, praying an act empowering commissioners to lay out a public waggon road from Hughes's coaling ground, on the South Mountain, to Frederick-town, at their own private expence, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. Baer, Mr. Brother and Mr. Shriver, to consider and report thereon.

A petition from Daniel Rofs, of Calvert county, praying an act of insolvency, was preferred, read, and referred to the committee on petitions of a similar nature.

Mr. M'Pherson, from the committee, brings in and delivers to Mr. Speaker a bill, entitled, An additional supplementary act to the act, entitled, An act for the marking of highways, and making the heads of rivers, creeks, branches and swamps, passable for horse and foot; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

On motion, the question was put, That the order for reading the bill to confirm an act concerning the jurisdiction of the general court on Tuesday the first day of December, be dispensed with, and that the said bill have a second reading on Friday next? The yeas and nays being required, appeared as follow:
