

A memorial from Christopher Richmond and John Wright, praying an addition to the salaries heretofore paid to them for their services as commissioner and clerk to superintend the settlement of the accounts of this state with the United States, under the resolution of November session, 1790, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. Pinkney, Mr. Key and Mr. Oneale, to consider and report thereon.

The report on the petition of Clement Hollyday, was read the second time and concurred with.

The report on the petition of Isaiah Tilghman, was read the second time, and the question put, That the house concur with the said report? Determined in the negative.

Mr. Shriver brings in and delivers to Mr. Speaker the bill for laying out a road by Banker's mill, in Frederick county, (as amended;) which was read the first and second time by especial order and passed.

On motion, Leave given to bring in a supplement to the act respecting the punishment of criminals. ORDERED, That Mr. Winchester, Mr. M'Mechen and Mr. T. Worthington, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

The bill to authorise the erection of a bridge over Great Pipe creek, was read the second time, and the question put, That the said bill do pass? Determined in the negative.

The house adjourns till to-morrow morning 9 o'clock.

T H U R S D A Y, December 10, 1795.

THE house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill to empower Henry Huntt, late sheriff and collector of Calvert county, to collect the balances due to him in the said county, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate by the clerk.
