

53 VOTES AND PROCEEDINGS, NOVEMBER SESSION, 1801.

The report on the petition of William Dawson, and others, was read the second time, the resolution therein contained assented to, and sent to the senate by the clerk.

The report on the petition of Thomas Nicholls, of Simon, was read the second time, the resolution therein contained assented to, and sent to the senate by the clerk.

The resolution in favour of the securities of Robert Sinclair was read the second time, assented to, and sent to the senate by the clerk.

Mr. Rose, from the committee, delivers to the speaker the following report :

THE committee to whom was referred the petition of David Kerr, of Talbot county, beg leave to report, that they are of opinion that the said David Kerr, from the particular circumstances of his case, is entitled to relief; they therefore recommend the following resolution :

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore pay to David Kerr, or his order, the sum of five pounds three shillings and eight-pence, money paid in by him for improvements on a tract of land called Glatferton.

THE committee appointed to examine the situation of the government house, and the furniture thereto belonging, further report, that considerable repair is necessary immediately to be done to the house to make it habitable, and to preserve it from further ruin, and are of opinion that it will require the sum of two thousand dollars for the repairs of the house, but that it will not be necessary at this session of assembly to appropriate more than twelve hundred dollars for this purpose; they therefore submit the following resolution :

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore pay to the order of his excellency the governor the sum of twelve hundred dollars, to be expended under his direction in the repairs of the government house.
