

On motion, ORDERED, That Mr. Young be stricken from the committee appointed to bring in a bill respecting the register of wills office of Caroline county, and that Mr. Mitchell be added to the said committee.

Mr. Hardcastle, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, An act to direct the register of wills for Caroline county to keep his office in Denton, in said county, and to deposit and keep the records, books and papers, belonging to said office; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Petitions from sundry inhabitants of York and York county, in Pennsylvania, and sundry inhabitants of Harford and Baltimore counties, praying a law may pass for amending and streightening the road leading from the city of Baltimore to York-town, in Pennsylvania, were preferred, read, and referred to Mr. Montgomery, Mr. Stansbury, Mr. E. Davis, Mr. Love and Mr. Sheredine, to consider and report thereon.

Petitions from sundry inhabitants of Baltimore county, counter to the petitions of sundry inhabitants of York and York county, in Pennsylvania, and sundry inhabitants of Baltimore and Harford counties, were preferred, read, and referred to the committee appointed on the petitions to which they are counter.

Mr. Veazey, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, An act authorising Lambert Beard, a collector of Cæcil county, to complete his collection; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Simkins, from the committee, delivers to the speaker the following report:

THE committee to whom was referred the petition of Thomas Beall, of Samuel, of Allegany county, stating that he obtained a special warrant of proclamation out of the western shore land-office, bearing date the twentieth day of May, eighteen hundred and one; that the said warrant was executed on the seventh of May, eighteen hundred and two, and a certificate made out the same day for two thousand nine hundred and forty-five acres of land, and praying that he may be permitted to bond for the composition money due thereon, reports that as there does not appear to be any thing peculiar in the case of the petitioner, they are of opinion the provisions of the existing laws of the land ought not to be departed from in his favour.
