

8 VOTES AND PROCEEDINGS, NOVEMBER SESSION, 1802.

The report being read throughout, the question was put, That the house concur therewith? Determined in the negative.

Mr. Wilson, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, An act to empower Isaac Purnell to erect a mill or mills on Choptank river, in Caroline county; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Bowie, from the committee, delivers to the speaker the following report:

THE committee to whom was referred the petition of John Smith Brookes, of Prince-George's county, beg leave to report, that they have examined the same, and are of opinion the prayer thereof is reasonable, and ought to be granted; therefore

RESOLVED, That all proceedings be stayed on a judgment obtained against John Smith Brookes, of Prince-George's county, at the suit of the state, until the first day of November, eighteen hundred and three, on his paying up all the interest due thereon.

Which was read the first and second time, and the resolution therein contained assented to.

The following resolution being propounded to the house, was read the first and second time and assented to.

RESOLVED, That the governor of this state be, and he is hereby requested, to transmit to the governor of Pennsylvania a copy of an act passed November session, eighteen hundred and one, entitled, An act to incorporate a company to open a turnpike road from Fort Cumberland to the western side of the Laurel Hill, at or near Union-town, with a request that it be laid before the legislature of that commonwealth for their co-operation, so as to carry the same into full effect.

The amendment to the bill requiring the register of wills of Baltimore county to give daily attendance at his office, was read the second time, and the question put, That the house agree thereto? Determined in the negative.

The supplement to an act for amending, and reducing into system, the laws and regulations concerning last wills and testaments, the duties of executors, administrators and guardians, and the rights of orphans and other representatives of deceased persons, was read the second time, and passed with the following amendments.

1. In the third line of the fourth page strike out the word "are" and insert "is."
2. In the same line and page, after the word "death" insert "except where the land is devised."
3. In the fourth line of the tenth page after the word "his" insert "or her."
4. At the end of the eleventh enacting clause insert the words "saving to the different schools in this state the rights which by existing laws they now respectively possess."
5. In the fifth line of the thirteenth page, after the word "been" insert "or may be."
6. In the sixth line of the same page strike out from the word "where" to the word "and" in the seventh line of the same page, and insert the words "the property of such person or persons so dying may lie."
7. In the second line of the last enacting clause, after the word "sections" insert the words "of chapter eight."
