

The amendment to the bill authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money for repairing Shrewsbury church, in Kent county, was read the second time, agreed to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

Mr. Clarke, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, An act to alter, change, lay out and open, a road from Middle-town, in Frederick county, to Washington county; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Van-Horn, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of Philip Green and Jacob Green, of Prince-George's county; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Veazey, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of John Savin, of Cecil county; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Purnell, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, An act enabling the inhabitants of Worcester county to stop Sinepuxent bay at or between the Haw Hammocks and the Thoroughfare; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Agreeably to the order of the day, the house resumed the consideration of the bill to incorporate companies to make several turnpike roads through Baltimore county, and for other purposes, and on further progression in reading the said bill, the question was put, That the thirteenth clause of the said bill be stricken out? Determined in the negative.

On motion, ORDERED, That the further consideration of the said bill be postponed till to-morrow.

Mr. Van-Horn, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, An act respecting courts of oyer and terminer and gaol delivery; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The clerk of the senate delivers a letter from Benjamin Galloway, of Washington county, endorsed; "By the senate, December 14, 1803: Read and referred to the consideration of the house of delegates.

**T**HE house met. Present the same members as on yesterday, except Mr. Ireland and Mr. Hatcheson. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The additional supplement to an act, entitled, An act to regulate elections, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate by the clerk.

The bill to enable the levy court of Talbot county to assess and levy certain sums of money for the respective purposes therein mentioned, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate by the clerk.

The bill for the benefit of the congregation of the German or High Dutch reformed christian church in Frederick-town, in Frederick county, and the additional supplementary act to an act, entitled, An act for the relief of creditors, and to prevent frauds and deceits occasioned by secret sales, mortgages and gifts, of goods and chattels, were sent to the senate by the clerk.

A petition from sundry inhabitants of Baltimore county, counter to the petitions from sundry inhabitants of the state for turnpike roads, was preferred and read.

The bill for the benefit of John Lyon, of Montgomery county, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate by the clerk.

A petition from sundry inhabitants of Allegany county, praying that the bounty may be increased for killing wolves, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. Bayard, Mr. Clarke and Mr. Cresap, to consider and report thereon.

Mr. Dickson, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, An act authorising the city commissioners to open and extend Water-street in the city of Baltimore; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Van-Horn, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, An act to authorise the opening of a road in Anne-Arundel and Prince-George's counties; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

A memorial from sundry inhabitants of Harford county, praying an act may pass for laying out a road, beginning at the ford on Stirrup run, between the end of Clendenen's lane and Walter Billingsleas, and ending at David Hanway's mills, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. Forwood, Mr. E. Davis and Mr. Montgomery, to consider and report thereon.
