The following resolution being propounded to the house, was read the first and second time, assented to, and sent to the senate by the clerk.

RESOLVED, That all proceedings against Philemon Willis, James Booker, Richard Barnaby and William Rose, on a judgment obtained against them, as securities of William S. Bond, for the recovery of a sum of money due by the said William S. Bond to the state of Maryland, be and they are hereby suspended until the tenth day of April, eighteen hundred and five; and that the said Philemon Willis, James Booker, Richard Barnaby and William Rose, be and they are hereby indulged in the payment of the said sum of money till the period before mentioned; provided, that the judgment aforesaid shall continue and be in force, notwithstanding the suspension of proceedings directed by this resolution, and if the sum of money that will then be due on the aforesaid judgment be not paid by the time aforesaid, an execution may be issued against them, or either of them, to enforce the payment thereof.

Mr. Shaaff, from the committee, delivers to the speaker the following report:

THE committee to whom was referred the petition of James Neale report, that they have had the same under consideration, and are satisfied that the said James Neale served as a faithful soldier in the artillery of the Maryland line for the space of seven years, and that he received a severe wound at the battle of the Eutaw Springs, from the effects of which, together with the infirmities attendant on old age, he is rendered entirely incapable of procuring a livelihood; they therefore recommend the following resolution:

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby directed to pay to James Neale, on application, the sum of fifteen pounds current money, and the further sum of fifteen pounds like money annually, in quarterly payments, as a support to him in his infirm situation, and in consideration of his many services as a soldier in the late revolutionary war, from the effects of which he has been rendered entirely unable to obtain a subsistence.
