

then the slip of paper aforesaid to be tied on by the said twine, over the knot of which shall be applied a small quantity of sealing wax, on which shall be impressed the seal of the said warehouse, in such manner as to prevent an opportunity of changing the said sample, or have the label thereof lost, or in any manner changed or altered; which said sample, so as aforesaid made up and labelled, shall be delivered to the person to whom the tobacco shall belong.

III. And be it enacted, That every inspector shall be paid at the rate of — cents for each sample of tobacco so as aforesaid made up, as satisfaction for the expense he shall incur in furnishing twine and sealing-wax, and for his trouble in performing the duties herein before required to be performed.

IV. And be it enacted, That if any inspector shall set his hand, and affix his seal, to any false sample of tobacco, or if any person shall, after having received an honest sample from the inspector, attempt to alter or change the same, or if any person but the inspector shall affix the warehouse seal to any sample of tobacco, or if any person shall counterfeit the warehouse seal, any such person so offending, on conviction thereof in any court of law, shall forfeit and pay — dollars for each and every offence, one half part of such fine to go to the informer, and the other half part thereof to the use of the county in which prosecution shall have been brought to issue.
