Also the resolution in favour of John Sterrett, and others, endorsed; "By the senate, January 7, 1805: Read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

M O N D A Y, January 14, 1805.

THE house met. Present the same members as on Saturday. The proceedings of Saturday were read. The bill, entitled, An act annulling the marriage of Joseph Boyd, of Prince-George's county, and Elizabeth his wife, was read the second time, and the question put, Shall the bill pass? Determined in the negative.

The bill, entitled, An act relating to stray black cattle in Allegany county, and the bill, entitled, An act to separate Rogers's addition to Baltimore-town from the city of Baltimore, and to make it a part of Baltimore county, were sent to the senate by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act for the regulation of officers fees, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate by the clerk.

Mr. Shaaff, from the committee, delivers to the speaker the following report:

THE committee to whom was referred the representation of Frederick Green respecting his account for printing the laws of Maryland compiled by William Kilty, Esquire, report, that they have taken the same into consideration, and find the facts stated by him to be true, and as his account is certified by different printers to be just and reasonable, they are of opinion that he is entitled to the balance appearing due to him; they therefore submit the following order:

ORDERED, That the committee of claims allow Frederick Green, on the journal of accounts, the balance appearing due him by his account laid before this house, the said account being certified to be just and reasonable by different printers.

The report on the petition of Joshua Barrett, of the city of Annapolis, was read the second time, the resolution therein contained assented to, and sent to the senate by the clerk.

The resolution directing the treasurer of the western shore to subscribe, on behalf of the state, for so many of the reserved shares in the bank of Baltimore as the second instalment of the two hundred thousand dollars loaned by the state for the use of the city of Washington, when received, will amount to, which was propounded to the house and read on the fifth day of January, was read the second time, and the question put, Will the house assent thereto? Determined in the negative.

The following resolution being propounded to the house, was read, to wit:

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby required and authorised to subscribe, on behalf of this state, in the — bank, — shares of the shares reserved for the use of this state in said bank, and immediately to pay to the president and directors thereof the amount of said shares, so subscribed, out of the second instalment and interest received from the United States on the loan made by the state for the use of the city of Washington.

On the second reading of the said resolution by a special order, the question was put, Shall the first blank herein be filled up with the words "bank of Baltimore?" The yeas and nays being required, appeared as follow:
