Mr. Harryman delivers a petition from Edward Norwood, counter to the petitions for a road from Baltimore to the district of Columbia; which was read and referred to the committee appointed on the petitions to which it is counter.

Mr. Bowles delivers a petition from Thomas Kennedy, of Washington county, praying for a special act of insolvency; which was read and referred to Mr. Bowles, Mr. Tabbs, Mr. J. Thomas, Mr. Cellar and Mr. Brent, to consider and report thereon.

Mr. Bland delivers a memorial from the president and directors of the Union Bank of Maryland, praying an alteration in their charter; which was read and referred to Mr. Bland, Mr. Worthington and Mr. J. E. Spencer, to consider and report thereon.

Mr. Harris delivers a bill, entitled, An act to alter and change the place of holding the elections in the first election district in Kent county; which was read the first and second time by especial order, passed, and sent to the senate.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill to authorise and empower the levy court of Anne-Arundel county to assess and levy a sum of money for the support and maintenance of Elisha Porter and Achsah Porter, who are idiots, the bill to incorporate the Baltimore Carpenters Humane Society, and the bill to appoint commissioners to review the road therein mentioned in Harford county, severally endorsed, "will pass."
