So it was resolved in the affirmative.

On motion by Mr. Bland, the following resolution was read.

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby authorised and directed, to pay unto the commissioners appointed to superintend the erection of a penitentiary, the sum of — dollars, out of any unappropriated money in the treasury.

The house, according to the order of the day, proceeded to the second reading of the additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act respecting the equity jurisdiction of the county courts, and, on motion by Mr. Dorsey, the question was put, That the 2d clause be stricken out for the purpose of inserting the following; "And be it enacted, That each of the judges of the several judicial districts of this state, during vacation, shall have the same power to grant and enforce, within their respective judicial districts, writs of injunction, in the same manner and with the same limitation as the chancellor of the state can or may exercise." Resolved in the affirmative.

On motion by Mr. Neale, the question was put, That the following be added to the 3d clause? "which said days shall be as nearly as may be equi-distant between the terms of the several and respective county courts." Resolved in the affirmative.

On motion by Mr. Dorsey, the question was put, That the following be added to the 4th clause? to wit: "and he shall have such compensation as the auditor of the court of chancery now has." Resolved in the affirmative.

On motion by Mr. Wilson, the question was put, That the following be added to the said bill? "and the sheriffs of the several counties shall execute and return all process which may issue from any court, by virtue of this act, in the like manner as they would have been compellable in case the same had issued from the court of chancery." Resolved in the affirmative.

On motion by Mr. Dorsey, the question was put, That the following be added to the said bill? "And be it enacted, That nothing herein contained shall be construed to authorise and empower any interference by the several county courts, or by the judges thereof, in any cause or process now depending, or hereafter to be issued, before or by the chancellor of Maryland, or to change the manner of issuing writs of error." Resolved in the affirmative.

The question was then put, Shall the said bill pass? The yeas and nays being required, appeared as follow:
