Mr. Burgess delivers a petition from Robert Walters, of Queen-Anne's county, praying that he may obtain a patent on his certificate of resurvey called Bourbon; which was read and referred to Mr. Burgess, Mr. Mi-ers and Mr. Bowles.

Mr. Bland delivers a bill, entitled, An act to incorporate the Builders Society of Baltimore; Mr. Bennett delivers a bill, entitled, An act annulling the marriage of Keziah Hutchinson and Robert Hutchinson, of Dorchester county; Mr. Bland delivers a bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of the heirs of Thomas M. Elderry; Mr. Groome delivers a bill, entitled, An act to prevent the destruction of sheep by dogs, and for other purposes; Mr. Warfield delivers a bill, entitled, An act annulling the marriage of Thomas Meek, and Anne his wife, of Anne-Arundel county; Mr. Neale delivers a bill, entitled, An act to authorise the levy court of Saint-Mary's county, to assess and levy a sum of money for the benefit of John Trueman Graves; Mr. Hebb delivers a bill, entitled, An act to authorise James A. Crane, of Saint-Mary's county, to convey certain land therein mentioned; Mr. Frazier delivers the bill, entitled, An act to alter and abolish all such parts of the constitution and form of government, as make the clerks of the courts of appeals, the clerks of the county courts, and the registers of wills, removeable only for misbehaviour on conviction in a court of law, as amended; Mr. Stevens delivers a bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money to purchase a fire-engine, and erect pumps, in the town of Easton, in Talbot county; and Mr. Davis delivers a bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act to lay out and straighten and amend a certain road in Harford county; which were severally read.

The bill for the relief of William Caton, and the bill to provide for building a bridge over Big Pipe creek, in Frederick county, were read the second time and passed.

The report of the committee relative to an exchange of laws with Virginia, was read the second time and the resolution therein contained assented to.

The bill for the relief of Jacob Kiler, the bill to authorise and empower the levy court of Montgomery county to assess and levy a sum of money on the assessable property thereof, for the purpose of building a clerk's office in said county, the supplement to an act, entitled, An act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from near Ellicott's lower mills towards George-Town, in the district of Columbia, and the bill to authorise a lottery or lotteries in the city of Baltimore for the purpose therein mentioned, were read the second time and passed.

On motion by Mr. T. Hall, the following order was read and agreed to:

ORDERED, That the chief clerk of this house send immediately to John Gill, notary public of the city of Baltimore, for the depositions of Levi Hollingsworth, John Holmes, William Gibson and William Steinson, which have been taken in pursuance of an order of this house, that the same may be read in evidence in the case of the report of the committee of grievances and courts of justice relative to Zebulon Hollingsworth, Esquire.

Mr. Boyle delivers a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Thomas Karney; which was read.

Mr. Bland delivers the following report:

THE committee to whom was referred the memorial of William Kilty, Esquire, chancellor of Maryland, report, that they have taken the same into consideration, and are of opinion the prayer of the memorialist ought to be granted; they therefore submit the following resolution:

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore pay to William Kilty, Esquire, chancellor of Maryland, or to his order, the sum of sixteen hundred dollars, as a compensation for his skill, labour, time and attention, bestowed on the work mentioned in his memorial, and his report to the legislature, in obedience to a resolution of the general assembly at the last session; provided always, that before any part of the above-mentioned sum of money be paid, the said William Kilty, Esquire, shall secure the copy right of said work, and assign the same to the state of Maryland.
