THE STATE OF MARYLAND, &c.

At a Session of the General Assembly of Maryland, begun and held at the Capitol, in the City of Annapolis, in the county of Anne Arundel, on the last Monday in December, the thirtieth day of the month, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty-seven, and in the fifty-second year of the Independence of the United States of America, pursuant to the constitution and form of government of the said state, the following proceedings occurred in the House of Delegates, viz.

AT eleven o'clock A. M. of said day, the names of the gentlemen declared and returned to have been duly elected to the General Assembly on the first Monday in October last, as representatives for the respective counties of the said state, and for the cities of Annapolis and Baltimore, were called over by the clerk of the House of Delegates, *pro tem.* according to the seniority of said counties and cities, in the following order, to wit.
