

By Mr. Ely, A further supplement to the act, entitled, An act relating to justices of the peace in the city of Baltimore, passed at December session, eighteen hundred and eighteen, chapter two hundred and nine.

By Mr. Turner, An act to regulate the gauging of casks, and the inspection of domestic distilled liquors in this state.

By Mr. Tilghman, An act to authorise Joshua W. Massey to convey the land therein mentioned.

By Mr. Hooper, An act to alter the time of the meeting of the general assembly of this state, and for other purposes.

By Mr. Bourne, An act to extend the time now allowed by law to Isaac Hooper, late collector of Calvert county, to complete his collections.

By Mr. Stewart of Anne-Arundel, An act to authorise the building a bridge across the south branch of the Patapsco river, from a point on the land of Richard Cromwell, to a point on the opposite shore, on the land of William Krebs.

Which said bills were severally read the first time, and ordered to lie upon the table.

On motion by Mr. Stewart of Anne-Arundel, the last mentioned bill was made the order of the day for Tuesday the 22nd instant; when on motion by Mr. Sempes, the said bill was committed to the committee on internal improvement.

By Mr. Hughes of Montgomery, the petition of Mary Smith, of George town, District of Columbia, widow of Charles Smith, who was a captain in the Maryland line of continental troops during the revolutionary war, praying that her name may be placed on the pension roll, in consideration of his military services in that war.
