Bills of the following titles, were also this day severally reported.

By Mr. Thomas of Cecil, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the more effectual protection of public worship in this state, passed at December session 1824, chapter 53.

By Mr. Hope, An act to repeal an act, entitled, A further supplement to the act, entitled, An act for making certain roads in Baltimore and Harford counties, passed at December session 1815, chapter 48.

By Mr. Donoho, An act to repeal a part of the act of December session 1820, chapter 24, so far as the same relates to the waters of Nanticoke river. And,

An act to provide for the valuation and condemnation of water at the mouth of Windsor's creek, in Somerset county, for the erection and establishment of a tide mill. And,

By Mr. Hitch, An act to authorise George Parker, senior, to remove a negro boy from the state of Delaware to this state.

Which said bills were severally read the first time, and ordered to lie on the table.

The clerk of the senate returned the bill and resolutions, sent to that body for concurrence, of the following titles:

A supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the establishment of vestries for each parish of this state; endorsed, "will pass."

A resolution in favour of John Dorgan, of Talbot county.

A resolution in favour of the state's agent, for the western shore. Severally endorsed, assented to. Whereupon, it was ordered, that the said bill and resolutions be severally engrossed.
