

The first of said reports was read the first time, and ordered to lie on the table.

The last report was twice read and concurred in.

The clerk of the senate returned the several bills, sent to that body for concurrence, of the following titles:

An act to extend the time now allowed by law to Isaac Hooper late collector of Calvert county to complete his collections; endorsed, "will not pass."

1. An act to provide for the valuation and condemnation of water at the mouth of Windsor's creek in Somerset county, for the erection and establishment of a tide mill.

2. An act for the preservation of the navigation of the rivers Transquakin and Chicknamacomico, in Dorchester county.

3. An act supplementary to an act, entitled, An act for the distribution of a certain fund for the purpose of establishing free schools in the several counties therein named, passed at December session 1816. And,

4. An act to alter the present mode of appointing the justices of the levy court of Dorchester county, so that each election district may have one member; severally endorsed, "will pass." Whereupon, it was ordered, That the four last mentioned bills be severally engrossed.

And communicated a bill, originated in, and passed by, the senate, entitled, An act authorising the recording of a deed from Daniel Schnebly, late sheriff of Washington county, to Emanuel Newcomer, which was read by its title, and referred to Messrs. Fitzhugh, Rentch and Yates.

Bills of the following titles, were this day severally reported:

By Mr. Steuart of Baltimore, An act to incorporate a company in the city of Baltimore, to be called The Mechanical Fire Company.

By Mr. Millis, An act relating to the public roads in Talbot county.

By Mr. Thomas of Cecil, An act to incorporate the Elkton and Susquehanna Bridge Turnpike Company.

By Mr. Somervell, An act for the revaluation of the real and personal property in Calvert county. And,

By Mr. Wells, A further supplement to the act for the recovery of small debts out of court, and to repeal the acts of assembly therein mentioned.

Which said bills were severally read the first time, and ordered to lie on the table.
