The said report, so amended, was then concurred in. And the message to the senate, submitted by Mr. Steuart. of Baltimore, on the sixth instant, in accordance with the recommendation of the committee, as stated in the said report, was then also taken up for consideration, read the second time, and the blank therein being filled with the names of Messrs. Steuart of Baltimore, M' Mahon and Semmes, it was assented to.

On motion by Mr. Thomas, of Saint Mary's, the house agreed to take up for consideration, the bill reported by him, as chairman of the committee on divorces, entitled, An act to divorce Augustus J. T. Giraud, and Mary Ann his wife, of the city of Baltimore; and the same having been read the second time, it was passed without amendment.

The house then adjourned until Monday morning ten o'clock.

MONDAY, February 11, 1823.

The house met. Were present, the same members as on Saturday. The proceedings of Saturday were read.

By Mr. Wells, the petition of Henrietta Maria Clara Hanlon, of the city of Annapolis, representing that she is entirely destitute of the means of living, and unable to procure it, in consequence of her afflictions; and praying, that the levy court of Anne-Arundel county may be directed to levy such sum for her support, as upon examination of her situation, she may appear to be entitled.

By Mr. Stewart, of Anne-Arundel, the petition of Thomas Cadle, of Anne-Arundel county, praying support for one of his children, an idiot.

By Mr. Lee, the petition of sundry citizens of Barnesville and its vicinity, in Montgomery county, in behalf of Eleanor Ward, of said village, a poor and destitute widow, with four helpless children, unable to support herself by labour; praying for her relief.
