

Scharf; late collector of the state tax, and of the county rate and assessment, of Baltimore county, reported the following resolution; which was read the first time, and ordered to lie on the table, viz.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the attorney for and on behalf of the state of Maryland in Baltimore county, be and he is hereby authorised and required, on all judgments now obtained, or hereafter to be obtained, on suits depending in the county court of said county, against the securities of Robert H. Scharf, by appointment of the justices of the levy court of Baltimore county, late one of the collectors of the state tax, imposed by the said justices in pursuance of an act of the general assembly of Maryland, passed at December session eighteen hundred and twenty-five, entitled, An act to provide a revenue for the support of government of this state, for all that part of the city of Baltimore comprising the sixth, seventh and eighth wards; and also by the said justices appointed late collector of the county rate or assessment imposed by said justices for the year eighteen hundred and twenty-five, to stay all proceedings after judgment as aforesaid against the said securities, or against the executors or administrators of said securities, until the first day of March, which shall be in the year eighteen hundred and thirty, provided the said attorney for and on behalf of the state shall be of opinion that the amount due and owing on said judgment or judgments is well secured; and provided also, that all and any of said judgments, upon which proceedings shall be stayed as aforesaid, shall continue and remain in full force, and executions may be issued thereon at any time after the expiration of such stay.

The clerk of the senate returned the bill, entitled, An act to authorise George Parker, senior, to remove a negro boy from the state of Delaware to this state, endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendment;" which amendment was read the first, and, by a special order, the second time, assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

And also delivered the following message; which was read:
