The bill reported by Mr. Stevens, chairman of the committee on claims, entitled, An act authorising the levy court of Talbot county, to levy on the assessable property of said county, the expenses incurred at a special court of oyer and terminer and gaol delivery, held at Easton, in said county, on the 23d of January 1828, and continued until the 26th of said month.

The bill reported by Mr. Steuart, of Baltimore, entitled, An act to establish the width of Orleans-street, in the city of Baltimore.

The bill reported by Mr. Hughes, of Charles, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act regulating fences in Charles and Allegany counties, passed at December session 1826, chapter 82.

The bill reported by Mr. Steuart, of Baltimore, entitled, An act for the widening of Orange Alley, in the city of Baltimore.

The several bills reported by Mr. Orrell, entitled,

A supplement to the act, entitled, An act for draining a branch, or swamp, called Bee Tree Swamp, lying and being in Caroline county, passed December session eighteen hundred and twelve.

An act relative to swine going at large in the village of Hillsborough, in Caroline county. And.

An act to repeal so much of the act of December session 1824, chapter 89, as relates to geese and swine going at large in the village of Denton, in Caroline county.

The bill reported by Mr. Potter, entitled, An act authorising the levy court of Caroline county to make the sheriffs of said county an allowance for ironing and unironing criminals committed to their custody. And,

The bill reported by Mr. M'Mahon, entitled, An act to enable Charles Carroll, of Carrollton, to receive patents for two warrants of resurvey on certain lands heretofore conveyed in trust by him; were severally taken up for consideration, in the order in which they are above stated, read the second time, and passed.

Mr. Lee submitted the following resolution for consideration:

Resolved, That the treasurer of the western shore, be directed to invest in the stock of such banks in the city of Baltimore, as he may deem most judicious for the interests of the county, such sum of money as may be due to Montgomery county, as her portion of the free school fund, and now lying dormant in the treasury of the western shore.

Which was read the first, and, by a special order, the second time, and assented to.
