

upon the poll books; and that his name was thereupon erased from the books of the polls by the said Judges.

(2.) It appears by the official return from Cecil county, that but three persons are declared duly elected Delegates for that county to the General Assembly, and that Thomas S. Thomas and William D. Mercer, had each an equal number of votes for Delegates as aforesaid.

(3.) A *special* return respecting the election in Queen-Anne's county has been made; whereby it appears, that the polls in the second or Church Hill District, were altogether rejected and excluded by the returning Judges, in consequence of irregularity in the qualifications of the Clerks of that District, who had been sworn and qualified *by a Justice of the Peace of the county, instead of by one of the Judges of Election*, as particularly directed by the act of assembly; and it further appears, that a computation of all the votes taken in the several Districts of the county resulted as follows: William Grason had 666 votes; Thomas Wright, the 3d. had 644 votes; Thomas B. Turpin had 641 votes; Samuel R. Oldson had 639 votes; Thomas Roberts had 633 votes; Roderick Earickson had 631 votes; Arthur E. Sudler had 630 votes, and Charles R. Nicholson had 629 votes. Mess:s. Roberts, Earickson and Nicholson, three of the gentlemen declared and returned by the Judges of Election as duly elected delegates for that county to the general assembly, have, it appears by a communication addressed to the Chancellor, refused to serve in that capacity.

When it was ascertained that of the above named delegates, so declared and returned to have been duly elected, sixty-six appeared in the chamber of the house of delegates, and answered to their respective names; which are as follow, to wit:
