

On motion by Mr. Wright, the following message, submitted by him, was twice read, agreed to, and sent to the senate:

By the House of Delegates, December 31, 1828.

Gentlemen of the Senate,

We have received your message proposing an interchange of services of the Reverend gentlemen appointed chaplains to the two houses, and concur therewith.

Mr. Steuart of Baltimore city, from the select committee on the subject, reported a bill, entitled, "A further supplement to the act, entitled, An act to incorporate an insurance company in Baltimore town;" which was read the first time, by its title, and ordered to lie on the table.

On motion by Mr. Steuart of Baltimore city, it was

Ordered, That the said bill have a second reading to-morrow.

The house then adjourned until to-morrow morning ten o'clock.
