

An act to divorce Eliza Howell, and her husband Isaac Howell, of Washington county. And,

An act for the relief of Elizabeth Shoebrooks, of Queen-Anne's county.

Mr. M. Mahon of Baltimore city, chairman of the select committee appointed on the subject, reported a bill, entitled, An act to incorporate the Phoenix Shot Tower Company of Baltimore.

Mr. Ely, chairman of the select committee to which the subject had been referred, reported a bill, entitled, An act to incorporate the Ely's Ville Manufacturing Company.

Mr. Eccleston, chairman of the select committee appointed on the subject, reported a bill, entitled, An act requiring the sheriff, coroners, elisors, or constables of Dorchester county, in advertising property for sale, to state the whole amount of debt and cost.

Mr. Steuart of Baltimore city, chairman of the select committee, to which the subject had been referred, reported a bill, entitled, An act to incorporate Christ Church in the city of Baltimore as a separate and distinct parish.

Mr. Shafer, chairman of the select committee to which the subject had been referred, reported a bill, entitled, An act for the opening a street in Boonsborough, in Washington county, to be called Patrick street.

Mr. Turner, of Calvert, chairman of the select committee, to which the subject had been referred, reported a bill, entitled, An act appointing a trustee to carry into effect the last will and testament of John G. Mackall, of Calvert county, deceased. And,

Mr. Wright of Queen-Anne's, chairman of the select committee appointed on the subject, reported a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Thomas Burchenal, of Caroline county.

Which said bills being severally read the first time, were ordered to lie on the table.

The house proceeded to consider the orders submitted by Mr. Thomas and Mr. Teackle, on the 24th instant, proposing additional rules for the government of this house; and on the second reading of the order offered by Mr. Thomas, the first additional rule therein contained was adopted.

Mr. Thomas moved to amend the second additional rule therein proposed, by inserting after the words 'except it be a resolution,' the following words, 'or the annual report from the committee on claims, or the committee on ways and means.' And on the question, Will the house agree to the amendment proposed? It was resolved in the affirmative.

Mr. Teackle then moved further to amend the said rule, by also inserting these words, 'and the reports of other standing committees,' to follow; immediately, the above amendment.

And the question being put, Will the house adopt the amendment proposed? It was resolved in the affirmative.

The yeas and nays being required by seven members, were ordered and taken.
