The hour having arrived for passing to the consideration of the orders of the day;

On motion by Mr. Teackle, the house proceeded to consider the unfinished business of Friday last, in relation to the bill, entitled, An act to amend and reduce into system, the several acts concerning elections.

The question then depending recurred, and was stated, viz. Shall the bill pass? When,

On motion by Mr. Ely, the house agreed to reconsider the fifth section thereof.

Mr. Ely then moved further to amend the bill, by striking out the fifth section thereof, which is contained in the following words:

"Sec. 5. And be it enacted, That it shall be the duty of the judges of elections in their respective districts in the several counties of this state, and in the several wards of the city of Baltimore, to appoint two of the constables of their respective districts or wards as aforesaid, to attend on the days of election at the place of receiving the votes in the different districts or wards as aforesaid, in which such constables may reside, for the express purpose of preserving the peace, and quelling disorder or riots, who shall each be entitled to one dollar for each day they shall respectively attend in virtue of this act. to be levied, collected and paid, as other county charges are levied, collected and paid."

And the question thereon being taken,
It was resolved in the affirmative.

The yeas and nays, being required by seven members, were ordered and taken.
