

Jeremiah Hughes states, he was not present when he voted, and cannot say for whom he voted.

Adam Miller testifies, that there was no objection made to his vote. He has no recollection of seeing the ticket of either of the persons named, except that of Bazil Rouke, who voted for John N. Watkins and George Wells, nor can he say for whom they voted.

Mrs. — Woollen, being sworn, testifies, that she does not know the age of Bazil Rouke, but believed him to be younger than her son Pollard Woollen. The question was asked her, do you know the age of your son Pollard? to which she answered, she did not. Mrs. Woollen presented a piece of paper upon which the birth of Pollard Woollen was written down, as having been recorded in October 1808, independent of this paper she knows not his age, as she cannot write or read.

William Brown being sworn, was asked, do you know the age of Bazil Rouke? He answered that he did not. In the year 1824, Rouke's mother told him she believed he was then sixteen, but she did not know.

William Sewell being sworn, was asked if he knew Samuel Johnson; he said he did, Where did he formerly reside?

Answer. In Annapolis; he shipped in the Mexican service about seven years ago from Baltimore.

Has he been at Annapolis since?

Answer. He has been here several times, and in August last returned to this place, where he now is.

Did you ever hear that he swore allegiance to the Mexican government?

Answer. He never did.

Where did he come from when he came here last August?

Answer. He was discharged from the United States ship Constitution in July last. Samuel Johnson told him it was necessary for persons going in the Mexican service either to swear allegiance to that government, or to take another name.

Levi Cole (being sworn,) was asked, do you know John Alexander?

Answer. He did.

Where did he come from, when he came here?

Answer. He came from Baltimore.

How long has he been residing here?

Answer, Since November 1827.

Had he been residing in Baltimore previous to that time?

Answer. He does not know, but he saw him in Baltimore a few weeks before he came here.

James White (being sworn,) was asked, do you know Joshua Lamb?

To which he replied I do.
