

And a memorial from sundry other citizens of said county, counter to the petition of sundry persons, inhabitants of said county, praying for a law authorising the opening of a public road from a place called Thistle Factory on the Patapsco river, to Elk Ridge church and the Savage Factory, in said county; which said memorials were severally referred to the select committee to whom has been referred the petition to which they are counter.

Mr. M<sup>c</sup>Mahon of Baltimore city, presented a memorial and petition of John P. Mackenzie, of the city of Baltimore, relative to certain charges and allegations contained in the report of the President and Directors of the Maryland Hospital; which memorial and petition were severally referred to a select committee, consisting of Messrs. M<sup>c</sup>Mahon of Baltimore city, Lee and Townsend.

Mr. Steuart of Baltimore city, presented a memorial of the President and Directors of the Allegany Iron Company, praying that the name of said company may be changed to that of the Youghogany Iron Company; which memorial was referred to a select committee, consisting of Messrs. Steuart and M<sup>c</sup>Mahon, of Baltimore city, and Turner, of Baltimore county.

And a memorial of William M<sup>c</sup>Donald, and others, citizens of Baltimore, praying for an act incorporating The Maryland Society for promoting the cultivation of the vine; which memorial was referred to a select committee, consisting of Messrs. Steuart and M<sup>c</sup>Mahon of Baltimore city, and Ely.

Mr. Wright, of Dorchester, presented a memorial of sundry inhabitants of Dorchester county, praying for a partial repeal of the act of assembly passed at December session of 1826, relative to the draining of certain low lands in said county; which memorial was referred to a select committee, consisting of Messrs. Wright and Harcastle of Dorchester, and Phelps.

Mr. Gibbons presented a petition of John Rider, and others, citizens of Somerset and Worcester counties, praying a charter for a bank, to be located in Salisbury, situated in said counties; which petition was referred to a select committee, consisting of Messrs. Gibbons, Done, Hitch, Boyer and Donoho.

Mr. Hope presented a petition of sundry citizens of Harford county, praying for the passage of a law, requiring the assessment on the taxable property of said county, of a sufficient sum of money for the complete repair of the gaol of said county, the building of a new one, or making additions to the present gaol, as may be judged most proper; and also for the building of two fire proof offices, for the use of the clerk and register of wills of the county, and the preservation and safe-keeping of the public records, appertaining to their respective
